



100 Years ago in Workington Offered as a full or half-day session



Activity

Each of the activity sessions will be led by a representative from the Helena Thompson Museum.

In this event, we take a look at what was happening in our home town of Workington at that time, and how life was affected by what was happening in the world. This was a time of great innovation and change.

- What was School like?
- Was there a Railway?
- What work did people do and how did they live?
- Was there 'fast food'?

The above topic will be explored using museum artefacts, (some of which may be replicas), craft, games such as a board game, snap, 'pairing cards', and quizzes.

Half Day - During the morning, each visiting group will be split into three to take part in activities; can we therefore please have at least three members of staff to accompany the group? Thank you.

Full Day - During the day, each visiting group will be split into four to take part in activities; can we therefore please have at least four members of staff to accompany the group? Thank you. After lunch, there will be extra activities.

Also, if required, this Event can include an activity about either Beatrix Potter the famous writer, who lived in the Lake District around 100 years ago, or an activity about local artists such as Percy Kelly, Sheila Fell and Conrad Atkinson.
