Activity

Each of the activity sessions will be led by a representative from the Helena Thompson Museum.

Come and have a look at maps and plans of Workington and see how the town has grown and changed over the years.

- Start the day by meeting at Workington Hall. Find out when it was built and who by.
- There was a 'special' visitor to the Hall in 1568 - who was it?
- In the late 1700's the large Tudor Manor house was changed to make it grander - find out about the person who designed all the changes.
- Are the older buildings nicer to look at than the new ones?

The above topic will be explored using, craft, plans and maps of 'old' and recent Workington, giant buildings board game, 'Pairing Cards', and quizzes.
